Here's how to form and use the Past Simple negative: Subject + did not + base form of the verb Contraction: "Did not" is often contracted to "didn't." Examples I didn't go to the party. This implies that the speaker did not attend the party. She didn't finish her homework. This means she did not complete her homework. They didn't see the movie. This indicates that they did not make a phone call to him yesterday.) She didn't arrive on time. (This means that she did not reach her destination at the scheduled time.) We didn't eat dinner together. (This indicates that having dinner together did not happen.) He didn't read the book. (This implies that he did not read the book at all.) The train didn't leave on time. (This means the train did not depart at the scheduled time.) She didn't pass the exam. (This indicates that she did not achieve a passing score on the exam.) I didn't hear the announcement. (This suggests that the speaker did not hear the announcement.) They didn't find the missing keys. (This shows that the keys were not found by them.) He didn't watch TV last night. (This indicates that he did not achieve a victory in the match.) She didn't bake the cake. (This indicates that baking the cake did not happen.) I didn't meet her The park They did not catch the bus We did not clean the house He did not write the report She did not complete the project on time I did not swim in the past. Using this tense accurately helps convey the absence of actions or events. To form negative sentences in simple past, we typically use this structure: Subject + "was" / "were" + "not" + subject complement (adjective, noun, etc). My dog wasn't hungry, for example. Alternatively, Subject + "did" + "not" + subject complement (adjective, noun, etc). verb in base form (+ other words) could be used. My wife didn't use her computer, for instance. The simple past tense is used to describe events that occurred in the past and are finished, generally occurring at a specific time in the past tense.
